

Scenario 2: What to do if a student has symptoms of COVID-19?

| Screening Results | Is a COVID-19 test required? | When can the child return to school? |
|--|------------------------------|---|
| 1 high-risk symptom OR ≥ 2 moderate-risk symptoms AND No COVID-19 exposure | YES* | <p>Negative COVID-19 Test: Free of fever for 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medicine. OR Free of fever for 24 hours without use of fever reducing medicine AND physician's written approval to return.</p> <p>Positive COVID-19 Test or NO* Test: Return to school at least 72 hours since resolution of fever without the use of fever reducing medications AND Improvement in symptoms AND At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.</p> |

**In cases where COVID-19 testing cannot be performed in a student with COVID-19 symptoms, the decision to return to school sooner can be made by the school and/or Kansas Department of Health and Environment in conjunction with the student's medical provider.*

Scenario 3: What to do if a student has been exposed to COVID-19?

| Screening Results | Is a COVID-19 test required? | When can the child return to school? |
|------------------------------------|---|---|
| Exposure to a person with COVID-19 | Can be considered based on local resources. | Quarantine for 14 days from last exposure to a person with confirmed or suspected COVID-19. This could be >14 days depending on the last point of contact. If a child develops high-risk or moderate-risk symptoms during quarantine, they need to be evaluated for COVID-19. |



Reopening Plan COVID-19

Welcome!

The following are details of Awesome Kids Preschool's COVID-19 pandemic plan.

Safety Training

All preschool staff will receive safety procedure training prior to the beginning of the school year. Preschoolers will be taught to wash hands appropriately.

Masks

Teachers will wear face masks and/or face shields when social distancing is not permitted. Children will not be required to wear a face mask. Parents who wish their children to wear masks are asked to provide a mask labeled with the child's name. Due to safety concerns, teachers will not be responsible for assisting students with masks.

Cohorts

Each AKP Preschool class will be treated as its own separate cohort. Classes will only interact within their own classroom and will not interact with children from other classrooms.

Cleaning/Disinfecting

Regular cleaning and disinfecting will occur throughout the school day. Efforts will focus on surfaces and items that are touched routinely and frequently throughout the day.

Washing Hands

Students will be taught to wash hands appropriately and be asked to wash several times during their day at preschool. This includes but is not limited to; when entering and exiting preschool, before and after snack, before and after outdoor play, and at restroom breaks.

Hand sanitizer will be used when students are unable to properly wash their hands.

Teacher Screening

Creating a safe learning environment is our number one priority. All preschool staff will undergo daily temperature checks as well as self-monitoring their general daily health.

Student Screening

A student's temperature will be taken before entering the building. Temperatures will be taken with a touchless thermometer. In the event your child has a temperature of 100.4, they will not be allowed to enter the building. Should your child develop a temperature during class, they will be taken to the preschool office, and asked to wear a mask until a parent is able to pick them up

Supply Sharing

Each child may have their own box containing their supplies such as crayons, markers, scissors, playdough, etc. Classroom shared supplies will undergo a strict disinfectant process between uses.

Visitors

We are limiting outside visitors. Parents and other visitors are asked to restrict unnecessary visits. In emergency situations, all visitors must wear a mask and report to the preschool office. Visitors must sign in upon arrival. Office staff will bring your child to the office for your convenience

Family Travel

Travel is left at the discretion of each family. We ask that if you travel internationally or to an identified hot spot for COVID-19 that the student self-quarantine for 14 days per CDC recommendation.

Snack

Handwashing will be required before and after all eating times. Each child is to bring their own snack and stored inside a lunch box along with a water bottle labeled with their name. Students will use disposable placemats at this time. All opened snack items will be discarded.



Playground

- Outdoor play will be a regular part of our daily activities.
- Students will be allowed and encouraged to use all playground equipment.
- Students will be required to wash hands before and after playing on the playground.
- Additional cleaning will be performed on all playground equipment and items between recess times.

COVID-19 Symptom Procedures

- Students who demonstrate multiple or serious COVID symptoms will be taken to the preschool office, assisted with a mask and await parent pickup.
- Faculty/Staff/Students must remain at home if anyone in their immediate household is awaiting COVID test results.
